BY THE NUMBERS



WYOMING TIPS



MAKE RESERVATIONS

Most Wyoming campsites require reservations, especially during peak season, May-September. Luckily, there are online reservation systems to help: TravelWY.com/state-park-reservations, recreation. gov and yellowstonenational parklodges.com.



CELL COVERAGE

Cell service and bandwidth are limited in Wyoming's more remote areas, so don't be surprised if you can't receive calls or texts or access the internet. Download maps and other key travel information before you hit the road. When exploring the great outdoors, always tell someone where you're going and when you plan to return. Disconnecting can be a good thing, of course, but only if you've planned for it



PACK SMART

Wyoming's wide elevation range means temperatures can swing drastically depending on region and even time of day. No matter the season, plan to dress in easily removable layers and bring a waterresistant jacket. Wear your parka, hat and gloves in winter.



PET RULES

Keep your dog on a 6-foot leash, pack out the poops and check ahead so you know where your pup may or may not be welcome. Turn to p. 50 to learn about pet rules at national parks and monuments.



BE ALTITUDE READY

Many of Wyoming's popular destinations are pretty high up. It may take you a couple days to acclimate, especially if you're coming from sea level. Remember: Drink plenty of water, go easy on alcohol and rest for a day or two before doing anything too strenuous.



DRIVE SAFELY

Always remember to observe posted speed limits. Please use pullouts to watch wildlife, take pictures and let other cars pass. Keep in mind that gas and service stops might be few and far between, so fill up when you can. Highways will shut down for hazardous winter-driving conditions, so please check routes before heading out and be flexible with travel plans. Find more driving tips at TravelWY.com/cartravel.




Summer features warm days and cool nights with low humidity. The comfortable temperatures encourage visitors to partake in activities in Wyoming's unspoiled wilderness, even when the sun goes down.

Things to Do: Camping under the stars, hiking, rodeo watching, horseback riding, rafting, rock climbing and experiencing historical sites and attractions are just a few options.



Winter temperatures can dip into the low digits, but the dry air facilitates perfect, fluffy snow for skiing and snowboarding at world-class resorts like Jackson Hole and other cold-weather pursuits.

Things to Do: Go snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, fat biking, snowmobiling, ice fishing and ice climbing — or explore the stunning otherworldly backdrops at Yellowstone National Park and Grand Teton National Park. Learn more about winter in Wyoming on p. 80.



Autumn's crisp, sunshine-filled days and color-changing leaves enhance the beauty of landscapes statewide.

Things to Do: Encounter splendid autumn scenery while driving scenic byways, strolling main streets virtually unchanged since the Old West, fishing in crystalline alpine lakes, and hiking and biking on trails lined with golden aspens. This shoulder season is also an excellent time to visit some of Wyoming's most popular attractions.



While snowfall is common through May at higher elevations, increasingly warmer days make spring a great time to enjoy many quintessential winter activities.

Things to Do: Enjoy skiing, snowshoeing and snowmobiling (depending on snow conditions). Since many species of wildlife migrate to higher elevations in search of fresh flora in March, April and May, spring is also a prime wildlife-watching season. Plus, this shoulder season is a superb time to cross some of Wyoming's most popular attractions off your bucket list.

Eyeing the sagebrush desert around Kemmerer, you might not guess that a freshwater lake thrived here 52 million years ago. Yet — thanks to ancient lake sediments — you can discover awesomely preserved specimens at Fossil Butte National Monument (a). The visitor center features 400-plus fossils and casts, from jewel beetles to crocodilians. Summer programs include fossil-preparation demos and digs for the museum's collection. Want to dig and keep your finds? Check out Ulrich's Fossil Gallery and American Fossil nearby.

The Bighorn Basin Geoscience Center Museum brings the awe of this fossilrich area to downtown Greybull. And with deposits dating as far back as the Cambrian Period (550 million years!), fossil fans have much to shout about. Hundreds of fossils, some you can touch, and a 40-foot mural bring the area's ancient ecosystems to life. Check for educational events, workshops and tours of significant area sites, including the Red Gulch Dinosaur Tracksite ③. And while you're downtown, pop into the Greybull Museum for local history. Find more fam-friendly dino experiences on p. 62.

Book a stay at **Bliss Dinosaur Ranch** in **Weston** for an experience you'll really dig: Your proprietor will guide you on an excavation of his property, which sits on 3,500 acres of the legendary

Hell Creek Formation. Through the years, hundreds of specimens have been unearthed on the ranch, from triceratops horns to T-rex teeth ... you might even take some home as souvenirs. Bonus: The ranch's guest quarters are decorated with treasures from previous digs.

Follow a mile-long trail through the Sundance and Morrison Formations at Cottonwood Creek Dinosaur Trail in Alcova. Signage and dinosaur-fossil evidence help you imagine the area during the late Triassic and early Jurassic periods. Or head to the Wyoming Dinosaur Center in Thermopolis for its expansive fossil collection (think 58 spectacular mounted skeletons) and hands-on programs like Dig for a Day, Kids Dig and the five-day Dinosaur Academy. Search for fossil specimens in an active dinosaur excavation site, then tour the museum with an expert guide.

10 DAYS IN Wild CARBON COUNTY

Wyoming adventure awaits in Carbon County's rugged Western towns. Start your trip from the south and progress west toward Rawlins, with stops along the way to soak up the area's must-sees.



ENCAMPMENT & RIVERSIDE

Encampment and Riverside offer a double-dose of outdoorsy bliss for the adventure-loving traveler. Stop for Grand Encampment Museum's ranching relics, rugged views of Medicine Bow National Forest (enjoyed best on foot along a section of the Continental Divide Trail) and the Thomas Edison marker that looks over brilliantly blue Battle Lake along the Battle Pass Scenic Byway. Feeling hungry? A ginormous Mountain Man pizza with Italian sausage, pepperoni, ham bacon and ground beef will soothe your empty tum at The Divide. For sweet dreams and lots of rustic allure, stay at the Spirit West River Lodge or Lazy Acres Campground, RV Park & Motel. Or, tack on some extra vacation days at A Bar A Ranch, a nearly 100,000-acre cattle and guest ranch along the banks of the North Platte River.



1 day / BAGGS, DIXON & SAVERY

Your road trip begins along the Colorado-Wyoming border as you travel through three charming towns steeped in frontier history — Baggs, Dixon and Savery. Pause for Wild West lore at Baggs Outlaw Stop and the Little Snake River Museum before continuing on the Battle Pass Scenic Byway for winding roads and breathtaking terrain. If you're feeling thirsty, mosey on over to The Cowboy Inn or the Dixon Club for a refreshing adult beverage. When it's time to retire, you'll have everything you need at Dixon Motel & Club. Or, if your schedule is loose: Ranch life calls for an extended stay at Three Forks Ranch or Antelope Ranch, where you'll horseback ride, fish and hike through Wyoming's scenic Little Snake River Valley.



3 days / SARATOGA

Known just as much for its blue-ribbon trout fishing as it is for its toasty mineral hot springs, Saratoga is a nature-lover's paradise cradled by the massive peaks of the Snowy and the Sierra Madre mountain ranges. You'll love this laid-back town for its easy access to all the things you love to do in Wyoming, like hiking, camping, hunting, snowmobiling and so much more. Stop to enjoy downtown Saratoga's unspoiled charm, then take a steamy soak in Hobo Hot Springs or go fly-fishing along the Upper North Platte River — where you just might spot a bald eagle. For some much-needed calories after a day spent outdoors: You'll delight in heavenly deli meats at Saratoga Sandwich Company or high-quality comfort food served with unique whiskeys at Firewater Public House. Then rest your head at Saratoga Hot Springs Resort or Hotel Wolf. Both offer one-of-a-kind Western history and delicious on-site restaurants.



1 day / ELK MOUNTAIN

As the northern gateway to the Snowy Range, Elk Mountain is a perfect place to pause for a day of tranquility. Found at the base of its namesake — the more than 11,000-foot-high Elk Mountain — this tucked-away locale got its start in the mid-1800s as a stage stop along the Overland Trail. You'll love Elk Mountain Museum's quirky local collections, plus the ample wildlife along the rugged and rolling Pass Creek Road. Be sure to savor the big, juicy steaks at the Historic Elk Mountain Hotel Restaurant before retreating to your room just a few steps away.

1 day / HANNA & MEDICINE BOW

Founded originally to serve miners and locomotives, the towns of Hanna and Medicine Bow will appeal to the historian and nature lover alike. You'll revel in the expansive sage-brush flats — and might see a nimble pronghorn (or three). Tour the Hanna Basin Museum and the Medicine Bow Museum for Western treasures, then head out for some fly-fishing along the cascading Medicine Bow River for trophy-sized rainbow and brown trout. After a day on the go, you'll appreciate hearty saloon fare and a room for the night at The Historic Virginian Hotel.



STARTING POINT ROUTE A: EVANSTON DOWNTOWN VISITOR CENTER

ROUTE A (FROM EVANSTON)

Roundhouse & Rail Yards Evanston

Evanston is home to one of the only remaining complete roundhouses on the old Union Pacific line between Omaha and Sacramento. This historical building — used by railroads to store and service locomotives - has a turntable that is still operational.

Fort Bridger State Historic Site (&) Fort Bridger

Several restored buildings highlight the history of this 19th-century fur-trading post, a vital supply stop for wagon trains traversing the Oregon, California and Mormon trails. Tour the reconstructed trading post and museum.

Fossil Butte National Monument (&) near Kemmerer

Colorful geologic formations rise about 1,000 feet above Twin Creek Valley and possess some of the world's best-preserved fossils, including those of fish, insects, plants, reptiles, birds and mammals.

Fossil Country Frontier Museum Kemmerer

A sampling of annual exhibits at this hidden gem includes a replica coal mine, bootlegging stills and wine presses, along with a preserved footprint belonging to a hadrosaurid (otherwise known as a duck-billed dino).

Star Valley Scenic Byway

This picturesque 80-mile stretch of Highway 89 starts at the Idaho-Wyoming border. climbs up Salt Canvon and Salt River Pass and descends into sprawling and verdant Star Valley. Then the route continues through the quaint communities of Smoot, Afton, Grover, Thayne and Etna before reaching Alpine and ending at the Lincoln County line in Snake River Canyon. Watch for the World's Largest Antler Arch, a collection of more than 3,000 shed antlers woven together over an Afton highway.

ntermittent Spring Afton

Known as the "spring that breathes," the Intermittent Spring near Afton is one of only three periodic springs in the world that flows on predictable intervals. To get there, head east on Second Avenue in Afton and hike the short trail along Swift Creek.

Jackson Hole Aerial Tram 🕓 Teton Village

Ride the tram in Teton Village up 4,139 feet to unparalleled wraparound views of Bridger-Teton National Forest and Grand Teton National Park

PINEDALE

STARTING POINT ROUTE B: FLAMING GORGE NATIONAL RECREATION AREA

ROUTE B (FROM GREEN RIVER)

Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area near Green River

Named for the landscape's natural kaleidoscopic hues, 207,636-acre Flaming Gorge is a land of living color. The reservoir is perfect for boating, fishing and kayaking, and the whimsical rock formations that frame the water change colors and perspective with varying sunlight. Tour this stretch of scenic roadway via bus tours with local guides. More info: tourwyoming.com/flaming-gorge-tour.

Seedskadee National Wildlife Refuge (&) 0 Green River

More than 220 bird species inhabit Seedskadee National Wildlife Refuge, which protects 27,230 acres of riparian, wetland and upland shrub habitats along the Green River. Keep your eyes peeled for bald eagles, trumpeter swans, moose and mule deer, or guarantee yourself wildlife spectacles within the refuge's family-friendly welcome center.

Killpecker Sand Dunes near Rock Springs

See Wyoming's wild geologic past in action at the Killpecker Sand Dunes located north of Rock Springs, Buttes, spires and towering dunes including the 400-foot-tall volcanic Boar's Tusk - will inspire Instagram posts galore, while ATVers will delight in 11,000 acres of scenic landscape.

Farson Mercantile & Ice Cream Shop Farson

Whether your flavor of choice is butter pecan or mint chocolate chip, a stop at Farson Mercantile - home of the "Big Cone" - for a scoop (or three) is a must. The crowd-pleasing pit stop also serves pizza, coffee and sandwiches.

The Museum of the Mountain Man Pinedale

The fur-trade era comes alive through period artifacts and authentic reproductions. Exhibits include an exact replica of an 1800s Sioux lodging and a life-size grizzlybear-attack diorama — featuring frontiersman Hugh Glass and inspired by the 2015 movie "The Revenant."


Green River Lakes & Squaretop Mountain near Pinedale

A pair of sparkling green-blue lakes in the Bridger-Teton National Forest, Green River Lakes boast awe-inspiring vistas of the Wind River Range's photogenic 11,695-foot Squaretop Mountain.

The National Museum of Wildlife Art Jackson

The National Museum of Wildlife Art in Jackson has more than 5,000 works of art representing animals from around the world, including pieces by Georgia O'Keeffe, Andy Warhol and John James Audubon. An additional bonus: It has incredible views of the National Elk Refuge.





Yellowstone **National Park**

STARTING POINT: SUMMIT INFORMATION CENTER, LARAMIE

Wyoming Territorial Prison State Historic Site (&) Laramie

This historical site is rich with tales of "violent and desperate outlaws," the most famous of which was Butch Cassidy. Browse exhibits on the penitentiary's prisoners and how it became a center for agricultural experimentation for the University of Wyoming.

Albany Lodge Laramie

Flanked by the Snowy Range, Laramie Plains and Medicine Bow National Forest, this lovingly restored 1907 hotel and cafe is a terrific home base for adventures in the surrounding wild lands.

Grand Encampment Museum Encampment

Wander through more than a dozen preserved historical buildings furnished with artifacts showcasing the history of the timber, mining and agricultural industries of the Upper Platte Valley at the turn of the 20th century. Don't miss the two-story outhouse.

Hobo Hot Pool

Saratoga Soothe your travel weariness away with a soak in a natural hot-springs Lander pool boasting a mighty toasty temperature (up to 119 degrees!). Revered by Native Americans for its peaceful, healing

properties, this historical spot is tucked on the banks of the rushing Platte River. Pack a picnic to enjoy behind the pool

when your fingers are sufficiently pruned.

Six Mile Gap Fishing near Saratoga

The North Platte River near Saratoga has multiple coveted fishing sections, including the Six Mile Gap — known for supplying a bounty of trophy trout. Join other eager anglers on the banks of the river on your own or connect with a local guide and outfitter. Find one starting on p. 95.

Wyoming Frontier Prison Rawlins

More than 13,500 people were incarcerated at the "Old Pen" during its 80 years of operation, including 11 women. Tour the prison, built in 1901 just three blocks off Main Street, to gain insight into its fascinatingly dark past.

South Pass City State Historic Site (&) near South Pass City

Drive the Wyoming Women's Suffrage Pathway, a 19-mile segment of Hwy. 28, on your way to a living ghost town complete with 17 authentically restored structures. The 1860s-era mining town is where Esther Hobart Morris served as justice of the peace and became the first woman to hold political office in the U.S.

Lander Bar Lander

Originally opened as a saloon in 1908, the bar served as a hotel, brothel and boarding house - among other things - before it was turned back into a saloon. Order a whiskey or craft beer, the perfect thirst quenchers after a day of rock climbing at nearby Sinks Canyon State Park.

Museum of the American West 0 Lander

Wander among original late-1800s log cabins and a white-painted schoolhouse for period artifacts like old-fashioned writing slates and quills. Indoor/outdoor exhibits teach about the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho peoples, the area's later inhabitants and what life was like on the Western frontier.

Wind River Indian Reservation Driving Tour


This self-guided tour of the Wind River Indian Reservation takes visitors to sites significant to the history and culture of the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho tribes who call it home, including the grave of Chief Washakie, the last chief of the Shoshone tribe.

National Bighorn Sheep Center Dubois

The world's largest wintering herd of bighorn sheep roams this remote area. Stop by the National Bighorn Sheep Center to view exhibits about the majestic mammals and set up a guided or solo tour to see them in their natural habitat.







Terry Bison Ranch Resort Chevenne

Climb aboard a custom-built train for a ride out to the middle of the working ranch's bison herd. At the ranch, bite into the Senator's Steakhouse's juicy bison burger, voted the Best Bison Burger in Wyoming by USA Today's 10Best.

Quebec 01 Missile Alert Facility State Historic Park near Cheyenne

Visit the world's only easily accessible Peacekeeper Missile Alert Facility and get an idea of what life was like for the well-oiled teams that worked here during Cold War times — from 1962, when it was built, through the beginning of the 21st century.

Fort Laramie National Historic Site near Guernsey and Torrington

Tour restored buildings at the largest military post on the northern plains at Fort Laramie National Historic Site, a former 1834 private fur-trading station turned military post to protect trail travelers.

Table Mountain Vinevards near Torrington

Table Mountain Vineyards' "pure Wyoming wine" is concocted using all-local ingredients. Make an appointment to stop in for sips of their semi-sweet Cowgirl Blush or the tart Cherry Rush.

Guernsey State Park

Explore historical structures built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s, including a museum located at the top of a cliff that gives way to expansive views of a sparkling reservoir.

Glendo State Park (&) Glendo

Sparkling Glendo Reservoir attracts boaters, water skiers, swimmers and anglers. Keep your eyes peeled for encampment rings and other artifacts from Native American tribes who once inhabited the area.

Jackalope Square Douglas

According to legend, the jackalope was born in Douglas when two brothers mounted a jackrabbit's body with deer antlers at their taxidermy shop. Pose with the 8-foot statue of the creature at Jackalope Square. Don't forget to tag #ThatsWY!

Ayres Natural Bridge Douglas

Discover a 100-foot-long natural rock arch spanning La Prele Creek west of Douglas. This oasis has a short trail that leads to a view of the "bridge" from above, as well as picnic tables that offer a break from the road.

Lou Taubert Ranch Outfitters Casper

This downtown Casper institution has supplied locals and visitors with boots, hats and other Western essentials since 1919. With more than 10,000 pairs of boots in stock, you're sure to find the perfect fit.

Miracle Mile Fishing near Casper and Alcova

Portions of the North Platte River that flow through the region - including the Miracle Mile system between the Pathfinder and Seminoe dams - abound with brown, rainbow and cutthroat trout. Connect with a local outfitter to boost your chances of reeling in the ultimate catch.

Wyoming Dinosaur Center & Dig Sites Thermopolis

Hundreds of displays and more than 30 mounted skeletons tell storied tales of Wyoming's prehistoric past. See the Archaeopteryx specimen one of only 10 in the world — or opt for a dig-site tour, where you can dig for fossils yourself. Learn more about Wyoming's fossils on p. 17.

Wind River Canyon near Thermopolis

Travel through time on the Wind River Canyon Scenic Byway in Thermopolis to catch glimpses of the canyon's 2,500-foot, pink-hued rock walls, which date back to the Precambrian period, as well as bighorn sheep and other wildlife. Keep an eye out for signage highlighting the canyon's geology along the way.







Devils Tower National Monument (&) near Hulett & Sundance

Connected by the John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway, Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks both offer dramatic scenery and unforgettable outdoor adventures — but make no mistake: They each deliver distinctly special experiences.

OLD FAITHFUL & NEW FINDS

1 HOUR, 1 DAY OR 1 WEEKEND IN YELLOWSTONE &

A dynamic volcanic hotspot that also boasts more than 1,000 miles of hiking trails, nearly 300 waterfalls and the largest concentration of mammalian wildlife in the lower 48 states? That's what we call a national treasure. Here's how to cash in on Yellowstone's riches, no matter how much time you have to spend.



YELLOWSTONE IN AN HOUR

If you're aiming for the Yellowstone speed record, make a beeline for the park's most famous feature: **Old Faithful Geyser**. With approximately 20 eruptions every day, this reliable geyser's frequency can be predicted with 90 percent accuracy, within about 10 minutes. Avoid the crowds with an early morning visit, then tuck in for a hearty breakfast at the **Old Faithful Inn**, a true icon of pioneer architecture.





YELLOWSTONE IN A DAY

While you can't see all of Yellowstone in a single day, it's relatively easy to prioritize the fascinating geothermal features for which the park is best known. Starting in the early morning at the east entrance, head to the West Thumb Geyser Basin, on the edge of Yellowstone Lake. Two short boardwalk loops will take you past the steaming Thumb Paint Pots, vibrant Abyss Pool and minuscule Fishing Cone. Then head over to Old Faithful for the next eruption, followed by a casual lunch at Geyser Grill.

Your next stop is Midway Geyser Basin, also known as Hell's Half Acre for the vaporous clouds clinging to its banks. The main attraction here is Grand Prismatic Spring — the third-largest hot spring in the world. This pool is bigger than a football field. Its enchanting colors are caused by the different species of heatloving bacteria that live in the spring.


Next, you're off to the Grand Loop just south of Madison. Take **Firehole Lake Drive**, a 3-mile scenic trip past at least a dozen geothermal features. With luck, you'll catch one of **Great Fountain Geyser**'s breathtaking and highly unpredictable displays.

If you're feeling adventurous (and time's on your side), keep going for Artist Point's bucket-list overlook of the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone's tumbling Lower Falls, then over to Brink of the Upper Falls overlook for more cascading grandeur. Now, head for serene mountain views surrounding Yellowstone Lake and back out the east entrance. Feeling hungry? Pause for a casual dinner at the historical Lake Yellowstone Hotel dining room.









DAY 1: Come in through the park's eastern entrance and head north to Mammoth Hot Springs. With a fantastical landscape straight out of Middle Earth, it's like a limestone cave turned inside out. Two boardwalks give you access to more than 50 geothermal features — including free-standing Liberty Cap, colorful Minerva and Palette Springs and Angel Terrace. History buffs will enjoy a quick side trip to Fort Yellowstone, just a stone's throw from the springs.

With an early start, you can tour the springs area and still set up your reserved campsite at Norris by 10 a.m. Break to make camp and lunch, then it's off to **Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone**. This 20-mile-long, 1,000-foot-deep natural work of art is best explored on foot, with the canyon's colorful walls rising around you. There are 10 official overlook spots in the canyon, and **Artist Point** is one of the most popular. After uttering your "oohs" and "aahs" at the spectacular view of **Lower Falls** crashing into the river below, leave the paved trail and keep hiking along the canyon's south rim to **Point Sublime**.





#YELLOWSTONEPLEDGE

DAY 2: Due northeast from Norris is the **Lamar Valley**. Thanks to a reliable water supply, lush vegetation and panoramic vistas, it's known as "America's Serengeti" for its large, easily visible wildlife population. On any given day, you might see herds of bison, pronghorn or deer; bald eagles and osprey in flight; or a badger, coyote or grizzly.

Nature-loving anglers can kill (or rather, catch and release) two birds with one stone, as the tranquil **Lamar River** offers some of Yellowstone's best fly-fishing. Surrounded by rolling verdant hills in all directions — and interrupted only by glimpses of the valley's plentiful fauna — visitors can expect to hook both rainbow and native Yellowstone cutthroat trout up to 15 inches long.

This afternoon, you're headed due south for an up-close-and-personal view of **Yellowstone Lake**. The largest high-elevation lake in North America and nearly 400 feet deep in places, it's too cold for swimming but is wonderful to explore by kayak or canoe.

Because of the lake's many hidden underwater geysers, submerged fumaroles and other geothermal features, we recommend a guided tour with one of the many outfitters in the area. After your paddle, enjoy a rewarding dinner in the charming Lake Yellowstone Hotel Dining Room before bidding farewell to the park — until next time.

LODGES, HOTELS & CABINS

From the elegant Lake Hotel to the Roosevelt Lodge inspired by Teddy himself, there are nine different lodging facilities in Yellowstone. Wi-Fi and TVs can be scarce in this neck of the woods, however, so bring that paperback book you've been saving.



CAMPGROUNDS

There are 12 campgrounds with more than 2,000 sites, and reservations are made through yellowstonenationalparklodges. com and recreation.gov.
Backcountry sites are also available with a permit.



OUTSIDE THE PARK

Whether you're seeking a bed-and-breakfast hideaway, a cozy cabin or a Westerninspired inn, there are dozens of accommodation options within the gateway communities of Cody (50 miles east), Jackson (60 miles south) and Dubois (80 miles southeast).

TETON TACTICS

HOW TO SPEND 1 HOUR OR 1 WEEKEND IN GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK (§)

With majestic mountains as your backdrop and forested trails, roaring rivers and more than 100 alpine and backcountry lakes beckoning for exploration, this wild wonderland is just a few miles from the town of Jackson.

GRAND TETON IN AN HOUR

If you're en route to Yellowstone or other points farther afield and only have an hour or so to play with, you're in luck — that's ample time to soak up some sights. Here are three ideas, which can be combined to fill a day trip.

TETON PARK ROAD

Known as the 42-Mile Scenic Loop Drive, the thoroughfare offers a great overview of the park, with stunning vistas of the Tetons and plenty of wildlife-viewing opportunities along the way. Pick up a map at Craig Thomas Discovery and Visitor Center, then choose a specific part of the loop to explore.

MORMON ROW HISTORIC DISTRICT

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, this photogenic tract of land was founded as a ranch settlement in the 1890s. Many of the original homesteads have been preserved, providing a slew of glorious photo ops with the majestic Tetons looming in the distance.

TAGGART LAKE TRAIL

The moderate route's short length (about 3 miles round trip) and minor elevation gain (roughly 300 feet) make it ideal for quick visits, big groups and little hikers. A handful of stream crossings and pretty lake views are sure to please any crew.

GRAND TETON IN A WEEKEND

Two to three days in the park can be a life-changing experience. Here's a flexible this-or-that itinerary to help you plan your perfect getaway.

DAY 1: MORNING

STRING LAKE LOOP HIKING OR BLACKTAIL BUTTE CLIMBING

Just under 4 miles round trip, the easy **String Lake Loop** offers outstanding views of the Cathedral Group. Mountain vistas and lake reflections are particularly breathtaking in morning light, so set that alarm. Or, if you need a little adrenaline with your morning coffee, **Blacktail Butte** offers 27 rock-climbing routes worth ascending.

AFTERNOON/EVENING

SNAKE RIVER RAFTING OR COLTER BAY KAYAKING

About 50 miles of the 1,056-mile-long Snake River are within the park, and every inch of the area is brimming with beauty. Hit **Schwabacher's Landing**, a launch point for anglers and rafters. **Colter Bay Marina** is a great place to rent a kayak; tool around for a few hours, then adjourn to **Jackson Lake Lodge** for dinner.

DAY 2: MORNING

MENORS FERRY HISTORIC DISTRICT OR LAURANCE S. ROCKEFELLER PRESERVE

After your active yesterday, start slow. Your self-guided walking tour through **Menors Ferry**, a perfectly preserved 1894 ghost town, provides a mellow and informative trip back in time to the Old West. Or beat the crowds with a scenic morning hike in the preserve — a specially designated area of the park with limited traffic.

AFTERNOON/EVENING

JACKSON LAKE DINNER CRUISE OR SUNSET HIKE AT OXBOW BEND


There's no better way to end your trip than with a little reflection. Cruise to **Elk Island** for al fresco gourmet dining in the shadow of the peaks. Or drive to **Oxbow Bend** to capture Mount Moran shimmering in the Snake River — then head into Moose for a final bite at **Dornan's Chuckwagon**.



TOP PLACES TO STAY IN GRAND TETON

With seven lodges, six campgrounds and two RV villages within park boundaries, there are no bad choices for accommodations in Grand Teton.

Jenny Lake is the most popular campground; its 49 conifer-shaded tent sites require a reservation, so plan accordingly. Jackson Lake Lodge is the place for views from every window, so it's also a top choice. Overnight spots fill up early, so be sure to book ahead of time. WYOMINGTIPS **FOR NATIONAL PARKS**





GETTING THERE.

Yellowstone Regional Airport (flyyra.com) is about 3 miles outside Cody near Yellowstone National Park's east entrance and offers service from Salt Lake City, Denver and Chicago. Jackson Hole Airport (jacksonholeairport.com) is about 60 miles south of Yellowstone and just 16 miles from Grand Teton National Park. Car rentals and shuttle services to lodges inside the parks, nearby towns and hotels are available from both airports.



ARRIVE EARLY (OR LATE).

Getting an early start maximizes your chances of finding parking, quieter trails and clear waters. During the peak season, there's often daylight until 9 p.m. or later, and many portions of the park clear out substantially by 4 or 5 p.m.



BE RESPONSIBLE

Dogs are not permitted on trails, pathways and boardwalks, inside visitor centers or in any park waters or thermal areas. Want a good rule of thumb? A pet may go anywhere a car can go, including roads, campgrounds, picnic areas and parking lots. Always pick up after your pets and keep them on a 6-foot leash in developed areas.



PLAN AHEAD.

With more than 2.2 million acres at Yellowstone and 310,000 acres at Grand Teton, the parks make up a sprawling destination, so you probably won't get to see everything in one trip. Make your mustsee list before arriving and plan on a return trip (or two or three). And be sure to book your campsite or lodge well in advance — these fill quickly, especially during peak season. It's \$35 per vehicle to visit Yellowstone or Grand Teton for one to seven days. Accessibility information can be found for Grand Teton at TravelWY.com/npsteton-access and for Yellowstone at TravelWY.com/nps-yell-access.



BE WEATHER AWARE.

Temperatures not only vary by season — they vary by elevation. Dress in layers, stay hydrated and be prepared for anything from warm summer temperatures to snow as late as June.



AVOID THE CROWDS.

Late June through late August is the parks' peak visitation season. Visit during the shoulder season in early June and September for a quieter retreat.



PRACTICE WILDLIFE SAFETY.

Be sure to stay at least 100 yards away from bears and wolves and at least 25 yards away from other animals, like bison. Stay safe from bears when you're out exploring by carrying bear spray, being alert, making noise and traveling in groups of three or more. Roads through the national parks are shared with all the wild creatures, so traffic halts frequently for them and speed limits are low. In fact, most traffic stops here are caused by wildlife crossings. Always stay in your vehicle if you're stuck in a wildlife jam. Never approach, chase or feed the animals. Learn more about bear safety at wgfd.wyo.gov.



Cell service, Wi-Fi and even television can be hard to come by when you're traveling around Yellowstone and Grand Teton. Be prepared to disconnect for the duration of your visit — and don't be surprised if sending and receiving texts becomes a challenge.

MORE THINGS TO DO ON WYOMING'S PUBLIC LANDS



DEVILS TOWER NATIONAL MONUMENT (§)

NEAR SUNDANCE & HULETT


This monolithic butte towers over the surrounding prairielands; and due to its vertical cracks, it's known as a world-class rock-climbing destination. Experience this scenic site for yourself by hiking one of the many trails, sleeping beneath the stars at Belle Fourche River Campground or stargazing on a guided night tour.

FOSSIL BUTTE NATIONAL MONUMENT &

NEAR KEMMERER

This geologic formation rises 1,000 feet above the Twin Creek Valley and is home to some of the world's best-preserved fossils, including those of plants, insects, reptiles and early mammals — which can be seen in the visitor center. While you're here, learn how paleontologists prepare fossils during daily demonstrations and bring a picnic to enjoy on the 1.5-mile Nature Trail. Find more fossil info on p. 17.











FORT LARAMIE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE & OREGON TRAIL RUTS NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK

NEAR GUERNSEY

Originally established as a private fur-trading outpost in 1834, Fort Laramie went on to become one of the largest military posts on the Northern Plains. Peek into the past at some of the remaining buildings, including the Commissary Storehouse and the Calvary Barracks. Just 15 miles away, see some of the best-preserved wagon tracks at the Oregon Trail Ruts, left by travelers moving westward in the 1800s.

BIGHORN CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA &

NEAR LOVELL

Take in the splendor of Bighorn Lake's sapphire waters for activities like fishing, kayaking, swimming and water skiing. Then leisurely drive along the spectacular park road, Highway 37, pausing for wild Spanish mustangs, bighorn sheep, short hikes for sweeping views of Bighorn Canyon's towering limestone walls (including Devil Canyon Overlook), historic ranches and numerous photo opportunities. Guided boat tours from Horseshoe Bend Marina with Hidden Treasures Charters are available for sightseeing and relaxation.

FLAMING GORGE NATIONAL RECREATION AREA

NEAR ROCK SPRINGS & GREEN RIVER

Lush greenery juxtaposed against towering red-rock formations sets the scene for this desert oasis, where Flaming Gorge Reservoir beckons with water fun. Rent a boat from a local marina — offering everything from houseboats to fishing boats — and cruise around the 91-milelong reservoir for wakeboarding, fishing or swimming. A number of boat-accessible campgrounds offer a secluded overnight experience.





HIT THE TRAIL EPIC HIKING & BIKING ROUTES

Whether you're hoofing it or testing the limits of gravity on our made-for-mountain-biking terrain, get your heart pumping with some of the West's greatest scenery as the backdrop at these adventurous locales.

Find your next adventure outdoors at TravelWY.com/outdoor.

TAKE A HIKE.

POPO AGIE FALLS TRAIL

Take in absolutely stunning views of Middle Fork Falls, where the Popo Agie River cascades over large outcroppings into Sinks Canyon on an easy 3-mile, round-trip route in Sinks Canyon State Park near **Lander**. Find the trailhead at Bruce's Picnicking Area.

BRIDLE TRAIL

This steep 4.5-mile loop begins at the base of Garden Creek Falls in Rotary Park near **Casper** and leads to breathtaking vistas of the town and dense evergreen forests. Sightings of sage grouse, deer and pronghorn are common.

GO BACKPACKING.

ROCK CREEK TRAIL

Trek through the heart of Medicine Bow National Forest on this 11-mile out-and-back. Highlights include a rushing waterfall and an optional side trip to Crater Lake — a stunning blue-green gem ringed with evergreens. Find the northern trailhead outside of **Arlington**.

TITCOMB BASIN

Titcomb Basin features kaleidoscopic wildflowers and sights of the jagged Wind River Range. The nearly 30-mile, out-and-back route encompasses the Seneca Lake, Indian Pass and Pole Creek trails; start your trip at the Elkhart Park Trailhead near **Pinedale**.

EXPLORE ON A BIKE.

WILKINS PEAK TRAIL SYSTEM

Trail names like Quick Draw and Better Than Dead evoke wicked Wild West lore, and so does the rugged terrain at this trail network near the town of **Green River**. Cyclists' hard work is rewarded with vistas of southwest Wyoming's Flaming Gorge country.

CURT GOWDY STATE PARK

Situated between **Cheyenne** and **Laramie**, Curt Gowdy State Park is crisscrossed with 30 miles of diverse mountain-bike trails, but one towers above them all: El Alto ascends steep granite boulders and black-diamond terrain before reaching the park's highest point.

GO PADDLING.

FLAMING GORGE NATIONAL RECREATION AREA

Panoramas of the gorge's multihued red-rock canyons are even lovelier from a raft, boat, stand-up paddleboard or kayak. Spend an afternoon surveying Flaming Gorge Reservoir, situated between **Green River** and **Rock Springs**, and be sure to catch the spectacular sunset.

SNAKE RIVER

Outfitters in **Jackson** host an assortment of rafting excursions along the Snake River, from white-knuckle expeditions to scenic family floats — all of which showcase the iconic natural grandeur of the Teton Mountains. Guided kayaking trips are also available.

GO FISHING.

MIRACLE MILE

This storied section of the North Platte River near **Casper** is the holy grail for serious anglers. Bring your nymph rigs and streamers to land behemoth rainbow and brown trout or enlist one of the many local outfitters to show you their secrets.

GREEN RIVER

Snowmelt from the Wind River Range feeds the Green River in southwest Wyoming, which becomes a hot spot for dry fly-fishing each summer. Get outfitted in **Pinedale**, then set out in search of trout.

GO ROCK CLIMBING.

TEN SLEEP CANYON

Most Common Route Type: Sport

Neighboring the small town of **Ten Sleep**, this canyon is home to supremely short approaches, so you can get straight to sending miles of steep dolomite crags loaded with pockets, crimps and edges. Bolts are plentiful (but there's a moratorium on setting your own route), and climb difficulties range from 5.6–5.14, with most falling between 5.10–5.12.

SINKS CANYON

Most Common Route Type: Sport

Climbers will feel at home in the town of **Lander**, which hosts the International Climbers' Festival each July. The big draw is nearby Sinks Canyon State Park, featuring more than 300 climbs on pocketed limestone, sandstone and granite.

GO HORSEBACK RIDING.

DAY RIDES

Day rides are a good way to stretch your legs while road tripping through the state, and local outfitters supply a variety of options, from one-hour to full-day trips. Under the wing of a knowledgeable guide, trot the grounds of Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks or survey the Bighorn, Wind River or Absaroka mountains.

SUMMER PACK TRIPS

Many outfitters and dude ranches also offer multiday guided pack trips, which let riders delve deep into the Wyoming wilderness on horseback. Excursions include authentic chuckwagon meals and cowboy breakfasts to counter the massive amounts of calories you'll burn in and out of the saddle on your journey. Learn more at TravelWY.com/horseback.

HORSE CAMPING

Wyoming's more than 45,000 square miles of public lands are laden with wide-open spaces and stunning landscapes perfect for discovering on horseback. Those planning a trip with their equine companion will find a bounty of boarding options and horse-friendly campgrounds and trails.

DUDE RANCHES

Wyoming dude and guest ranches allow visitors to participate in incredible horseback-riding programs that include daily opportunities to partake in excursions of various lengths. A seasoned wrangler will pair you with a horse for the entirety of your stay (typically a week) who perfectly matches your riding abilities. Learn more on p. 68.






can tower up to 4 feet, elk are a majestic sight to behold. Favorite haunts include Medicine Bow National Forest outside Laramie, the Greater Yellowstone **Ecosystem and** western Wyoming's Star Valley. Many elk journey to the **National Elk** Refuge in Jackson each winter.

WYOMING WILDLIFE **BINGO**

With more than 400 bird species and 100 mammal species (jackalope not included), Wyoming is a wildlife lover's dream. See if you can spot these eight critters on your next visit.




TIPS FOR VIEWING WILDLIFE

If you're observing wildlife, always do so ethically with the safety of you and the wildlife in mind.

- Never feed wildlife.
- Keep a respectful distance this means 100 yards from bears and 25 yards from other wildlife.
- Stay quiet and still.
- Never chase or harass wildlife.
- Utilize scenic pull-outs and parking areas whenever possible.
- When stopping on roadways, park a safe distance from traffic and turn on your hazard lights.



In addition to the wild, scenic countryside that draws people to Wyoming, our state features small- and big-game hunting and vast herds of wildlife. Nearly every species of North American big game exists in large numbers

within the state, including elk, moose, deer, pronghorn antelope, bighorn sheep and mountain goat.

It's no surprise that hunting is a way of life for residents and locals alike. This lifestyle helps with the management of Wyoming's incredible wildlife resources. The money hunters and anglers spend through the purchase of licenses and outdoor products goes toward protecting the health of herds and the lands they need to thrive. Plus, nutritious and natural protein from wild game is the ultimate in locally sourced food.

When Wyoming locals and visitors come together through their love of hunting and the outdoors, lasting memories are made. Whether hunting is a family tradition or a new adventure, working with a certified outfitter or guide from the Wyoming Outfitters and Guides Association (WYOGA) increases chances for a successful hunt.

Besides a worthwhile hunting trip, many guides and outfitters offer fishing excursions, horsepack trips, backcountry wilderness adventures and accommodations. Even nonhunters can work with these local experts to see wildlife and experience Wyoming's breathtaking scenery.


2 DINO EXPERIENCES

GETTING TO YELLOWSTONE

Many visitors reach Yellowstone National Park by air via the two small Wyoming regional airports that service the park. Yellowstone Regional Airport near Cody is approximately 50 miles from Yellowstone's east entrance; and Jackson Hole Airport, located at the edge of Grand Teton National Park, is approximately 50 miles south of Yellowstone's south entrance. Both airports have car and shuttle services to nearby towns and hotels. From early November to mid-April, most of the park's roads are only open to oversnow travel — or guided snowmobile and snowcoach tours. Find a list of companies authorized to provide snow-safari tours and oversnow transportation to Yellowstone's attractions from towns near the west, south and east entrances at nps.gov/yell.

THINGS TO DO

Explore the backcountry and trek past the national park's famous thermal features in silence by snowshoeing or Nordic skiing on groomed trails specially prepped for wintertime visitors. Gear is available for rent from local outfitters; and if you'd prefer not to go it alone, there are authorized guides who can show you the sights as well. Get out early in the morning when animals like deer, wolves and bison are most active and the light is prime for taking photos. Arrange for snowcoach tours to the Norris and Upper geyser basins, Old Faithful and

Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone. The National Park Service typically also hosts ranger-led excursions and activities from mid-December through mid-March.

Those seeking a faster ride can check out Yellowstone's portion of the Continental Divide Snowmobile Trail with an authorized commercial guide from Cody (go to nps. gov/yell to see a full list of guides). You can also apply for Non-Commercially Guided Snowmobile Access Program Permits, which are awarded annually through a lottery system at recreation.gov. A limited number of snowmobilers are allowed access to the trails each day, and advance reservations are recommended.


REST EASY

Old Faithful Snow Lodge & Cabins, which has dining facilities and visitor services year-round, and newly renovated Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel & Cabins are the only lodging options available inside the park itself. Visitors can also stay in Jackson, Cody or other nearby towns and book excursions into the park with authorized NPS concessionaires like Jackson-based Teton Science Schools or Scenic Safaris and Cody-based Gary Fales Outfitting. WINTER, WYOMING-STYLE

Whether you dream of carving first tracks through a silent wilderness, cutting up the snow on a high-powered sled or soaking your days away at a hot spring, here's how you can get outside and play once the flakes start falling.





ICE FISHING

Wyoming's frozen waters reveal hardy stashes of fish — plus an endless supply of solitude. Boysen Reservoir stocks everything from walleye to burbot, Flaming Gorge teems with lake trout and Keyhole Reservoir is swimming with perch, crappie and northern pike just below the ice.

SKIJORING

Winter magic comes in all forms in Wyoming, but there's something particularly special about roping up with a horse (or even your pup) in a sport that mixes adrenaline, speed and cross-country skiing. Find a skijoring event and skim across the snow in towns like **Sheridan**, **Sundance**, **Pinedale**, **Jackson Hole** and **Saratoga**.

DOG SLEDDING

Not only is dog sledding a perfect way to give your legs a break from skiing and other winter sports, it's a thrilling way to see some of Wyoming's prettiest backcountry. Snuggle up as a team of lovable huskies mush through Jackson and Dubois, both home to multiple tour providers.

SNOWSHOEING & CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

On a pair of skis or snowshoes, you may never shake the feeling that you've stepped inside a snowglobe. Exploring scenic trails at national forests around the state — like Sinks Canyon State Park and Beaver Creek Nordic Ski Area (Lander), Tie City and Happy Jack (Laramie), and Bear River State Park (Evanston), where you may share the trail with a resident elk or bison — are great places to start.

HOT SPRINGS

Wyoming's bubbling geothermal springs are like nature's hot tubs. Have a dip and a sip at **Saratoga Hot Springs Resort**, home to the state's second-oldest craft brewery. **Hot Springs State Park** in **Thermopolis** features prehistoric rock formations, and dreamy **Granite Hot Springs** is perched above a waterfall in a peaceful forest near **Jackson**.

FAT BIKING

With their monster tires and grippy tread, fat bikes put Wyoming's snowy terrain within easy reach. The rugged trails of **Dubois** and abundant switchbacks and loops of **Lander** are fat-bike favorites, and you can crunch through hundreds of groomed trails from **Jackson Hole** to **Laramie**.

SNOWMOBILING

Blankets of powder, breathtaking vistas and thousands of miles of trails make Wyoming a top-ranked spot for snowmobiling. Options abound in Pinedale and Dubois, where you can access the legendary Continental Divide Snowmobile Trail to see the Wind River and Absaroka mountains. Towns like Saratoga, Centennial, Riverside, Encampment and Laramie link you to the vast Snowy Range, and dramatic scenery awaits in the Bighorn Mountains near Sheridan.
