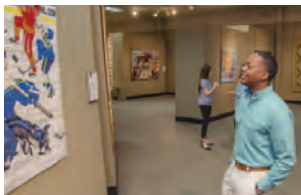

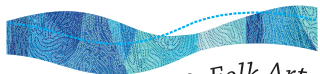

HISTORY

Founded in 1827 by William Clark of Lewis & Clark Expedition fame, Paducah's significant American heritage can be traced to the city's strategic location at the confluence of the Ohio and Tennessee Rivers.

Riverfront **"WALL TO WALL" MURALS** by the Dafford Mural Team weave the story of Paducah's past and guide viewers to experiences and landmarks throughout the town.

HISTORY

Historical Markers & Landmarks

Paducah boasts more historical markers per capita than any other city in Kentucky. Landmarks include the Coke Plant, the legendary Chief Paduke statue; Wacinton, a Peter “Wolf” Toth carving of a Native American—part of the Trail of the Whispering Giants; Steam Locomotive No. 1518; and the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. monument.

Port of Paducah

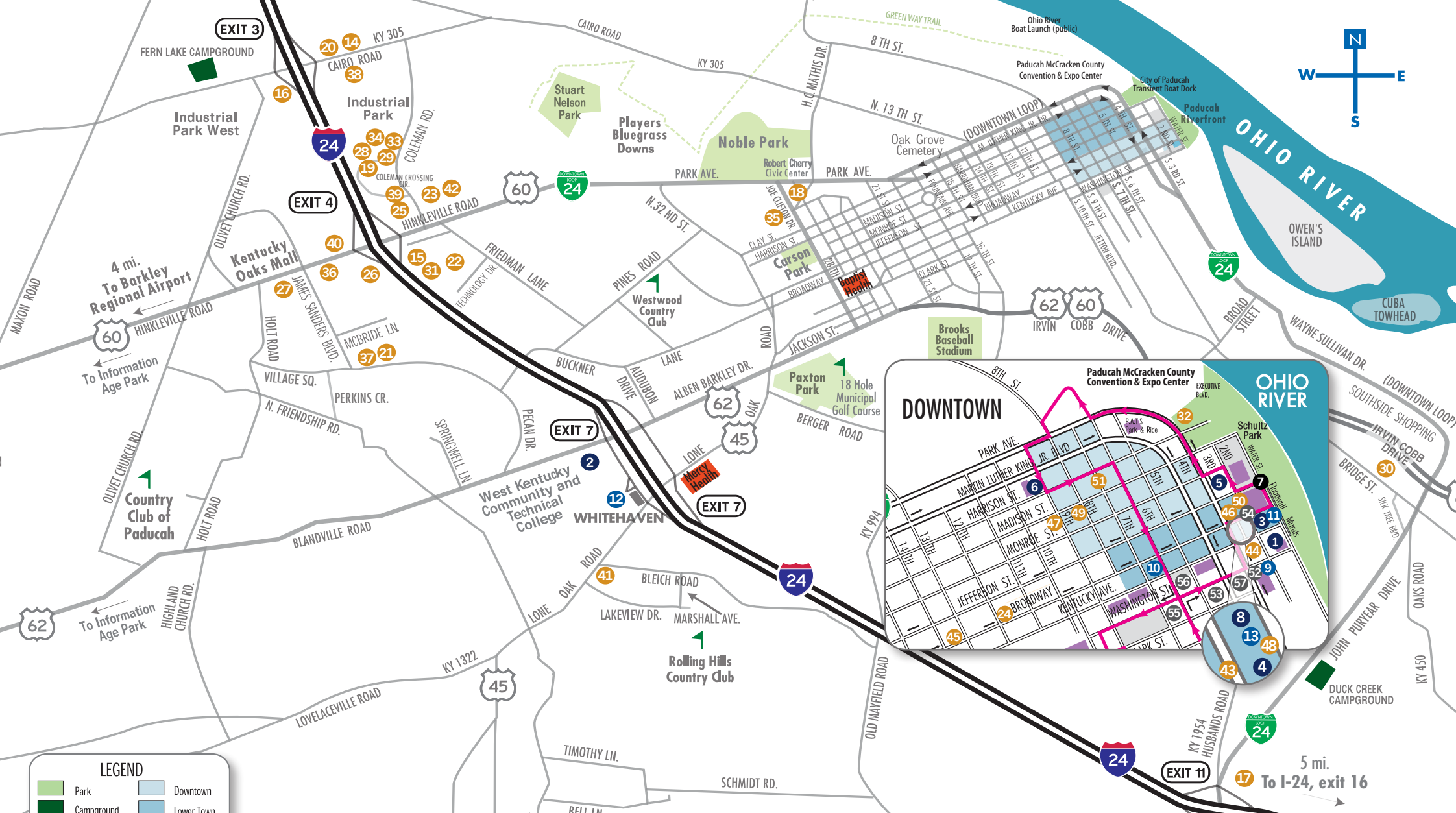
